White Wines



1st day: "Rheinessen"

Welcome at the airport of Frankfurt and transfer by bus to the hotel in Mainz. After a recreation phase we will visit this old town and will have our first wine tasting with wines of "Rheinessen", the region in the south of Mainz, the biggest wine producing area in Germany. Besides mass production of wine also high premium wines are cultivated in this region.

2nd day: "Nahe", "Palatinate"

From Mainz we will start our tour towards Bingen where the river Nahe flows into the river Rhine. Following this river till Bad Kreuznach we will have passed this little wine producing area. After this region we will visit one of the largest German wine producing regions, the Palatinate. Here the landscape is smoother and rich sunshine together with the soil of the Palatinate result in strong wines. We will participate in a wine tasting in the famous barrel of Bad Durkheim. In the afternoon we will visit Speyer with its roman style cathedral, world heritage by definition of the UNESCO.

3rd day: "Mosel"

We will follow the meanderings of the river Mosel in order to study another region of white wine culture. Here the hills are steeper and the wine normally tastes fresh and fruity. We will have a stop in Bernkastel-Kues to visit the typical middle age market place and some picturesque houses. In the afternoon we will reach Trier, a city founded by the Romans in the year 16 AD with monuments of all historical times from the Romans (Porta Nigra) to the house where Karl Marx was born.

4th day: "Middle Rhine", "Rheingau"

Starting in Rudesheim we will visit the world heritage "Oberer Mittelrhein" traveling by ship to Braubach with

castle „Marksburg“. We can taste the wine of the region "Mittelrhein" during the cruise. We will return by bus and will visit the Abbey of Eberbach, not only known by the film "The name of the Roses" but also for 900 year's tradition of wine cultivation. The typical grape of the Rheingau is the "Riesling" and in the region between Wiesbaden and Rudesheim we can find the finest wines of this grape.

5th day: "Bergstrasse", "Baden"

This day we will follow the river Rhine to the south on the "Hessische Bergstrasse" and after the city of Heppenheim the "Badische Bergstrasse" both located at the descent of the highland "Odenwald". Heidelberg is known for the first university in Germany (founded in 1385) as well as for its Renaissance castle. After a walk through the town we will continue our journey towards the Black Forrest and Freiburg, where we can taste the highlights of the "Badische Wein" in a wine tasting. This wine takes advantage of the sunny and mild climate of the region.

6th day: "Württemberger"

From Freiburg we will start to the beautiful landscape of the southern Black Forrest and will continue towards North, where we enter into the wine producing region of Württemberg. We will to the city of Stuttgart where we will visit the museum of Mercedes Benz with its historical cars. Late in the evening we will reach our hotel in Wurzburg.

7th day: "Franconia"

We will use this day for walking instead of travelling by bus. We will visit the baroque Residence of Wurzburg, World Heritage, with the famous roof painting of Tiepolo.



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The afternoon will be free for your individual trip through the town until we will meet again for a wine tasting of wines from Franconia. *The typical bottle for wine of Franconia is the "Bocksbeutel", a round bodied bottle.*

8th day: Frankfurt

From Würzburg we will drive to Frankfurt. After a round trip to see the famous skyline of the city we will walk through the historical center with its town hall, the Römer, and the church of St. Paul where the first German constitution was elaborated in 1848. Most famous son of the town is Johann Wolfgang von Goethe. We can visit the house where he was born. In time for Check-In we will be at the airport of Frankfurt.



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
